Updates from the Inkster Family Literacy Movement

The Inkster Family Literacy Movement (IFLM), led by a dedicated team of community partners, works towards a common vision - to enhance the literacy skills of the entire community, starting with its children. In pursuit of our goal we host many activities and events including fan favorite: our monthly McDonald's Family Literacy Night.

Over the course of the summer and fall, children and their families had the opportunity to listen to storytellers, practice yoga, meet live parakeets, play fun literacy activities, and select free books to take home after receiving a free Happy Meal. Yum!

Starfish Family Services Addresses our Region's High Infant Mortality Rate

Starfish Family Services strives to create better outcomes for children and families who reside in some of Michigan's poorest areas, including Detroit and Inkster, through an impressive variety of programs. Parents in Detroit and Inkster face the highest infant mortality rate in the state and among the highest in the country.

So what's being done to address this troubling problem?

One of the key ways Starfish works with expecting moms is through a home-visiting program to provide support, education and resources. Through the Maternal & Infant Health Program, Starfish staff provides parent education and care coordination services to pregnant women and infants less than 12 months of age. Moms who participate in this program receive support from both a nurse and licensed social worker. Both disciplines provide education and support around various topics such as safe sleep, breastfeeding, nutrition, infant development, secondhand smoke effects, the importance of attending routine prenatal/well-child check-ups, and maternal stress and depression prevention. Many of the pregnant women in the program are young and having their first child. They often feel scared and unsure about what labor, delivery and taking care of an infant will be like. Many of these young women do not feel their OB-GYN has enough time to address their questions and concerns, nor do they have appropriate and positive role models in which to turn to. It is through conversations with their nurse and social worker within the comforts of their own environment that pregnant women feel supported and able to make informed decisions about the choices they make in their pregnancy and about their infant.

Introducing Thrive by Five Detroit

Imagine a community where babies are born healthy and where curious children are arriving at kindergarten doors ready for school and life success. Parents and caregivers are engaged, educated and meeting the challenge of raising successful adults. Thrive by Five Detroit, a collaboration spearheaded by Starfish Family Services and comprised of Development Centers, Focus: HOPE, and Southwest Solutions, endeavors to make this a reality for Detroit children.

Earlier this year, we received funds from the federal Office of Head Start to pioneer an innovative prenatal through age five approach which will initially serve 1,000 children and families. We will provide a comprehensive Early Head Start and Head Start program that addresses the needs of not only the child but also the needs of the caregivers. Expectant parents are encouraged to enroll as we will also offer prenatal care that ensure babies are off to the earliest and best start.



Young Achievers Going Places
