What We Are Doing: By the Numbers

I communicate daily with our entire staff at 4:00. It's the best part of my day. I applaud their devotion, share well-being tips from our Starfish therapists, and detail the tangible fruits of their devotion via a COVID-19 report.

- Provided **therapy sessions** to 1,268 behavioral health clients by video or phone.
- Connected with 683 of our children's families via online **education portals** that include face-to-face time with their teachers.
- Organized **distribution hubs** to deliver basic-life resources to 3,573 community families---including 19,000+ diapers.

What We Are Doing: Advocating for Change

The extraordinary toll that COVID-19 has taken on Michigan's communities of color has put a global spotlight on the social inequalities we have been battling for too long.

Our Starfish leaders are serving on the front lines as vocal advocates---to fix broken systems in the short-run and for long-term positive change. We regularly contact more than 35 county, state, and federal officials and policy makers advocating for urgent funding to critical behavioral health providers.

Starfish's message is clear: Funds must get to the front line, so professionals can meet the needs of their clients. These are especially perilous times for our families who desperately rely on mental health assistance to navigate through uncharted trauma.
